# Communication Task Force Recommendation Summary of Events –

# <u>May 17, 2016</u>

Board of Commissioners approves the creation of the Leelanau County Communication Task Force during its May Regular Session; members include –

### <u>June 9, 2016</u>

First meeting of the Task Force is held. Commissioners Rentenbach and Wessell were elected as Chairman and Vice-Chairman, respectively. Action items included an overview of the current system and its limitations; the need for new equipment in Dispatch; the current equipment in the Field, Law Enforcement, Fire and Dispatch; improvements supported by the 911 Committee and the Fire Chiefs Association; 800 MHz system benefits; Responder safety with interoperable communications; other potential equipment requests, and funding and timeline options.

### <u>June 30, 2016</u>

The Task Force reviewed potential equipment and the associated costs – radio upgrades; NexGen911 and CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch); potential funding options and a timeline.

# July 13, 2016

Equipment and the associated costs were again reviewed. A review of the current budget, including the Tower Fund, the 911 Annual Budget and grants were discussed. Potential funding options such as a millage and utilizing money from the County General Fund, a 911 Surcharge or the Tower Fund was also discussed, along with a timeline and deadlines. Several funding scenarios were reviewed (attached to those minutes).

### July 22, 2016

Equipment and the associated costs were again reviewed by the Task Force. The potential funding options of a 911 millage, utilizing the General Fund and/or a 911 Surcharge were also discussed at length.

A motion was made by Dodson and seconded by Julian, *"that based on the equipment identified, the County recognize the obligation to purchase that equipment through the funding mechanisms discussed here and presented by the Treasurer, with the County bearing the obligation, not the Fire Departments or Townships."* 

There was a consensus of the Task Force to present <u>all funding options</u> to the Board for consideration.
