Harbormaster Report

Marina is winterized and ready for winter. We have everything in place for whatever winter throws our way. The blowers and fans have all been tested and they are fully functional. The winter storage of boats has been laid out for maximum occupancy with safety and accessibility of first consideration. We have left a wide roadway large enough for a firetruck to service buildings of needed.

As in the past I will leave the gates open until snowfall no longer allows access to safely use the launch ramps and parking. This has been the practice over the past few years as requested by the board. If you have any revisions to this policy let me know and I will act accordingly.

Treasurer Chris Mikowski and I have been meeting with software companies from the Camis Corp who we currently use for reservations through the state of Michigan, Scribble Corp and DockWa Corp. These meetings are to secure a system of accessibility, accounting and processing. Our currently used system consists of a homemade form and mail merging from different programs. It has been in use since before 2005 and is totally dependent on manual processing and offers no modern optional payment processes or remote accessibility.

After discussing the plans for renovations with the engineers we have coordinated to complete the renovations needed on the south wall of the marina. Since we are not adding the raised cement wall I will plan on building the same system we put on the north wall. This will include all new decking and buffer wood with our 4x6 bumpers. This can be completed and is recommended to be done before the building phase.

Timberlee Water Update

Dawn Lund, Vice President of Utility Financial Solutions presented her rate analysis showing the rate increases needed to finance the options the Board is considering for upgrading the Timberlee Water System hydropneumatic tank to meet EGLE requirements. Engineer Ken Schwerdt presented four options for the replacement. Option 2, (per the written report) replacing the one tank with two brand new tanks would add redundancy to the system, would have an assumed 50 year design, would be in a heated building and seemed to be the preferred option of the residents at the public meeting. This option would require a 7% increase in user rates which translates to \$2.25 per month. MOTION BY TRUSTEE LAUTNER, SECONDED BY TRUSTEE DARGA TO GO AHEAD WITH TWO NEW TANKS FOR TIMBERLEE WATER SYSTEM. The motion passed 6-0 by a roll call vote.

Supervisor Shaw added that he had filed a statement of intent to apply for a state revolving fund loan but it seemed unlikely that we would qualify. In speaking with bond counsel, they suggested rolling the Timberlee financing in with the marina financing as a possibility.

Marina Phase III Costs Update

Engineer Ken Schwerdt presented the updated drawings for the Marina Phase III project. The placement of the new building in the current location will keep the building above the flood plain. Raising the seawall won't be necessary but he did leave in the sea wall along the creek. The new design has a potential savings of 1.9 million. MOTION BY TRUSTEE DARGA, SECONDED BY TRUSTEE TREVAS TO APPROVE THE NEW DESIGN PER THE PRESENTATION AND INCLUDE THE ENGINEERING COST OF \$45,000.00. Motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

Nauticat Request/Winter Storage

Jack Nowland presented his request to conduct maintenance work on the Nauti-Cat while it is stored in the Elmwood Marina as was done last year. He reviewed pictures of all of the precautions that were taken last year and it all worked out very well. MOTION BY TRUSTEE LAUTNER, SECONDED BY TREASURER MIKOWSKI TO ALLOW THE NAUTICAT TO PERFORM WORK AGAIN. A voice voted passed 5-1 with Trustee Darga voting no.

Marina Seasonal Rates

Clerk Preston suggested that rates should be raised by 3.7% which was the cost of inflation as of August. Our consultant had recommended that we at least keep up with inflation. Trustees were in agreement. MOTION BY TRUSTEE TREVAS, SECONDED BY TRUSTEE DARGA TO INCREASE SLIP RATES AND MOORING RATES BY 3.7%. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote. MOTION BY TRUSTEE TREVAS, SECONDED BY TRUSTEE DARGA TO MOVE TRANSIENT RATES FROM EXISTING G CATEGORY TO H CATEGORY. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

Budget Amendment

Clerk Preston introduced the budget amendment explaining that it was to cover the cost of paving the small section of Bluewater Drive and to cover the cost of supplies being ordered in preparation for next year's election cycle. MOTION BY CLERK PRESTON, SECONDED BY TRUSTEE DARGA TO ADOPT RESOLUTION 16 OF 2023, A BUDGET AMENDMENT RESOLUTION. The motion passed 6-0 by a roll call vote.

Metro Act Right of Way Permit Extension/AT&T

Clerk Preston explained that this permit extension is the same language used in the last one which is expiring in February of 2024. MOTION BY TRUSTEE LAUTNER, SECONDED BY TRUSTEE DARGA TO APPROVE THE METRO ACT/ AT&T EXTENSION. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

- 1. Funding for Timberlee Water, Phase 3 of the Marina project and Brewery Creek parking are on the Agenda this evening. Bonding these projects together will potentially save us a significant amount of fees.
- 2. The telephone system at the Township Offices and Fire Department have outlived their useful life. We are having a lot of issues with them. Quotes for a new system are on tonight's agenda.
- 3. I attended the New Waves ground breaking on Bugai Road on October 9. There were representatives there from throughout the County, as well as Habitat for Humanity and other representatives interested in "affordable" housing.
- 4. Our grounds crew is pretty well finished up for the season. Sprinklers are blown out, pavilions winterized and equipment is put away for the season. A couple crew members are still picking up leaves. A huge thank you to them for another year of hard work.
- 5. We're still working with the Leelanau Road Commission, MDOT, our Engineers and TTCI to figure out if we're able to have sidewalks/trails along Cherry Bend Road. Once we figure out a design, how it will be paid for will be the next hurdle.
- 6. We're working with the Board of Public Works attorney to have an ordinance done to update the new way that water connection fees will be charged. The actual fees will be set by resolution, which will be coming your way in the near future.
- 7. We were awarded \$2500 for the Par Plan Grant for security cameras. I just need the OK to sign accept the award. Installation will start November 15, 2023.

WHEREAS, the Charter Township of Elmwood, County of Leelanau, State of Michigan (the "Township"), intends to authorize the issuance and sale of general obligation limited tax bonds pursuant to Act 34, Public Acts of Michigan, 2001, as amended ("Act 34"), in one or more series, to pay all or part of the costs of acquiring, constructing, furnishing and equipping certain public improvements in the Township, including: a) Marina improvements, including building, parking, dock and seawall improvements; b) water system improvements, including tank improvements; and c) parking lot improvements at the Brewery Creek parking lot; together with all related equipment, site improvements, appurtenances and attachments (the "Projects"); and

WHEREAS, the total amount of bonds to be issued to finance the acquisition and construction of the Projects shall not exceed Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000); and

WHEREAS, a notice of intent to issue bonds must be published before the issuance of the aforesaid bonds in order to comply with the requirements of Section 517 of Act 34; and

WHEREAS, the Township intends at this time to state its intention to be reimbursed from proceeds of the Bonds for any expenditures undertaken by the Township for the Projects prior to issuance of the Bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Township Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish a notice of intent to issue the Bonds in the *Leelanau Enterprise*, a newspaper of general circulation in the Township.

- 2. The notice of intent shall be published as a **display advertisement not less than** one-quarter (1/4) page in size in substantially the form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A.
- 3. The Township Board does hereby determine that the foregoing form of Notice of Intent to Issue Bonds, and the manner of publication directed, is adequate notice to the taxpayers and electors of the Township, and is the method best calculated to give them notice of the Township's intent to issue the Bonds, the purpose of the Bonds, the security for the Bonds, and the right of referendum of the electors with respect thereto, and that the provision of forty-five (45) days within which to file a referendum petition is adequate to insure that the Township's electors may exercise their legal rights of referendum, and the newspaper named for publication is hereby determined to reach the largest number of persons to whom the notice is directed.
- 4. The Township makes the following declarations for the purpose of complying with the reimbursement rules of Treas. Reg. § 1.150-2 pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended:
 - (a) The Township reasonably expects to reimburse itself with proceeds of the Bonds for certain costs of the Projects which were paid or will be paid from funds of the Township subsequent to sixty (60) days prior to today.
 - (b) The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for the Projects, including issuance costs, is \$6,000,000.
 - (c) A reimbursement allocation of the capital expenditures described above with the proceeds of the Bonds will occur not later than 18 months after the later of (i) the date on which the expenditure is paid, or (ii) the date the Projects are placed in service or abandoned, but in no event more than three (3) years after the original expenditure is paid. A reimbursement allocation is an allocation in writing that evidences the Township's use of the proceeds of the Bonds to reimburse the Township for a capital expenditure made pursuant to this resolution.
- 5. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution are hereby rescinded.

The Michigan Planning Enabling Act requires the Planning Commission to draft a Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for the Township Board. Included in the CIP are any projects, structures, equipment, or expenditures that are over \$10,000 and will last for more than a year. Below is the process for approval.

- 1. Department Heads submit projects for the next 6-7 years
- 2. List of Projects is compiled
- 3. Planning Commission reviews the projects and determines compliance with the Master Plan or other appropriate plan. The Planning Commission may call upon officials to explain project(s) as needed
- 4. Planning Commission hold Public Hearing on draft CIP (October 24, 2023)
- 5. Planning Commission makes recommendation to the Township Board (October 24, 20232 the Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the CIP to the Township Board.)
- 6. WE ARE HERE Township Board reviews and adopts. Township Board may make changes as necessary

The Michigan Planning Enabling Act, Public Act 33 of 2008, requires that any township that owns or operates a water supply or sewage disposal system, prepare and update a capital improvement program each year. Even when not required, it is good practice for townships to have a capital improvement program to help foresee upcoming projects and assist in budgeting. This is an update to the Capital Improvement Plan that the township undertook in an effort to comply with the requirements of the Michigan Planning Enabling Act.

This plan is a working document. It is required to be reviewed every year and updated to add the next year to make it a 6 year plan. Projects that are included in the plan are not guaranteed to be completed or to receive financial allocation by the Township Board but more of a guide during the budgeting process to help see a more complete view of upcoming major projects. The Planning Commission does not endorse the projects or figures supplied. They are only approving a document that puts all the projects in one location for easy reference.

The Capital Improvement Plan contains projects/construction/equipment with a purchase price greater than \$10,000 that last for longer than a year. These items include purchase of property and vehicles, new buildings/structures, constructions of utilities and roads, and dredging as examples. This also included major repairs to existing structures, properties, and vehicles such as roofs and parking lots. Minor maintenance and projects that are estimated to cost less than \$10,000 were not included. Plans and studies are also not included in this Capital Improvement Plan.

Department heads were asked about projects that they anticipate will need to be completed in the next 6 years as well as projects that will need to be done in future years so that they are not forgotten when the plan is updated in future years. Those forms led to this document that includes future projects, anticipated dates of completion, and estimated costs. Also included in this document is a list of existing facilities, where they are located, when they were constructed and any other helpful information. This ensures that when updating the plan in the future, certain properties and buildings are not looked over.

Upon completion of the draft, the Planning Commission held a public hearing on xx/xx/2023 to obtain additional public comment. Following the public hearing the Planning Commission made a recommendation on the plan and forwarded the completed plan to the Township Board for review and adoption.

Existing Facilities

Lincoln Road Campus

Township Hall

Located at 10090 E Lincoln Rd, the Township Hall was constructed in 1986. Contains offices and hall for meetings and available for rent.

Fire Hall

Located next to the Township Hall but not connected, was constructed in 2002. Contains offices, kitchen, meeting room, and apparatus bay.

Upper Pavilion

Located near the Township Hall and shares parking with the Hall. Picnic pavilions that contains restrooms. Available to rent to the public.

Lower Pavilion

Located near the corner of Cherry Bend and Avondale. Contains restrooms.

Soccer Fields

Located behind the Township Hall. Turf was re-done in 2015 and contains an irrigation system. Currently there is a contract with North Star Soccer to maintain and schedule the soccer fields.

Baseball Fields

Located near Cherry Bend Rd. Maintained by the Township and used by Little League. Available to the public for use when not in use by Little League.

Playground

Located near the corner of Cherry Bend and Avondale. Playground equipment has been installed throughout time.

Tennis Court

Located next to Avondale Ln. Surface sealed in Spring of 2016.

Cherry Bend Campus

Old Fire Hall

Located at 10750 E Cherry Bend Rd. Constructed in 1945. Contain garage bay and meeting room. Currently used for storage, elections, and maintenance equipment. Parking area contains recycling bins for use by County residents. Parking area constructed in 2014.

Greilickville Campus

Harbormaster Building

Located at the Marina, the harbormaster building was constructed in 2020 and contains the public office and bathrooms for the marina. Also includes storage garage for marina equipment. Old harbormaster building still exists on site and is anticipated to be removed during phase 3 of the marina redevelopment.

Old Marina Public Bathroom

Located next to the harbormaster building and scheduled for demolition during phase 3 of the marina redevelopment. This building is obsolete with the construction of the new harbormaster building.

Picnic Pavilion

Located next to the old marina public bathroom. Contains tables and grills. The roof for this structure was from an old pavilion at the Greilickville Harbor Park. This structure is scheduled to be replaced during phase 3 construction of the marina redevelopment.

Boater's Bathroom

Located next to the old marina public bathroom and for use by marina users. Includes showers and restrooms for men and women. This building is scheduled to be demolished and replaced during phase 3 of the marina redevelopment.

Large Pavilion

The large pavilion is located in the Greilickville Harbor Park, near the parking lot. It contains restrooms and a picnic pavilion. The pavilion is available to rent.

Small Pavilion

The small pavilion is located in the Greilickville Harbor Park. It contains restrooms and a picnic pavilion. This pavilion is available on a first come, first serve basis.

Brewery Creek

Brewery Creek is a condo development on M22 across from the Greilickville Harbor Park and Marina that the Township purchased in 2012. A majority of the property has been used for overflow marina and park parking. The Township worked with the owners to dissolve the condominium and is currently working on developing overflow marina trailer parking.

Greilickville Water

The Greilickville water system runs along M22 from the City/Township line North to Cherry Bend Road. The water system also runs down Carter Rd and Grandview Rd to the TART trail.

Timberlee Water

The Timberlee water system started as a private system in the 1970s and was turned over to the Township in 1989.

Greilickville Sewer

The Greilickville sewer system is located along M22 from the City/Township line running North to Crain Hill Rd. It also includes some subdivisions off of M22. The sewer system runs West down Carter Rd, Grandview Rd, and Cherry Bend Rd.

Cedar Lake Dam

The Cedar Lake Dam is located between Cedar Lake and West Grand Traverse Bay. The dam is owned by the Township and controls the depth of Cedar Lake.

DeYoung Natural Area

The DeYoung Natural Area was purchased by the Township in 2010 in cooperation with the Leelanau Conservancy. The Natural Area is currently managed by the Leelanau Conservancy.


The lease agreement has an initial term of five years with nine five-year automatic renewals. The monthly rent would be \$800.00 with a 5% escalation rate per term.

RE: Verizon Wireless Lease Proposal

This memo is meant to aid the Board with discussion regarding the proposal from RJP Consulting dated November 6, 2023 regarding a Verizon Wireless Lease Proposal.

Throughout the past two years, I have strongly encouraged the Township to abide by its Zoning Ordinance. The proposed use is not a permitted use within the Municipal Center (MC) Zoning District. The proposed use is only permitted, through a Special Use Permit, within the Agricultural-Commercial (A-R) Zoning District.

If the Board would still like to entertain this proposal, I encourage you to first consider and review the many specific requirements and standards of the use (see attached). Specifically, please draw your attention to Section 9.8.A.3.h; as the proposed height would be 120,' the tower would need to be located a minimum of 120' from all parcel lines and buildings, unless the tower is certified to collapse onto itself. The proposed tower would not meet this requirement.

The only parcels zoned A-R that the Township owns are 004-021-023-00 (0 E Cherry Bend Rd) and 004-020-034-10 (9505 E Cherry Bend Rd). The use of both parcels is a park (DeYoung Natural Area). As the Township acquired both parcels from the Conservancy, there may be restrictions that prohibit Wireless Communications Facilities.

Please also note that this proposed facility may not appropriately align with the Township's Community Park, Recreation, Open Space & Greenways Plan which was adopted by the Township Board on 1/30/2023. See attached for excerpts from said Plan.

- A. Special land use approvals, and any conditions of approval, shall run with the land and be binding upon the applicant and any subsequent successors, heirs, or assigns.
- B. If substantial construction has not taken place within one (1) year of the special land use approval date, the special land use shall expire.
- C. The Planning Commission may grant two (2) extensions of a special land use approval, of an additional one (1) year period for each extension, provided that the applicant submits an extension request prior to the one year expiration date of the special land use approval or a prior extension. To grant an extension, the Planning Commission must find that any delays were beyond the control of the applicant, and that the applicant will complete substantial construction within the one (1) year extension period.

SECTION 9.6 APPEALS OF SPECIAL LAND USE APPROVALS

The Planning Commission shall grant or deny approval of all special land use applications. A person aggrieved by a decision of the Planning Commission in granting or denying approvals of a special land use, or regarding any conditions attached to approval of the special use permit, may appeal the decision to the Zoning Board of Appeals per the requirements of Article 12 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 9.7 SPECIAL LAND USE APPROVAL AND LAND USE PERMITS

Special land use approval still requires issuance of a land use permit. The Zoning Administrator shall issue a land use permit only after all conditions (if any) which can be met prior to issuance of the land use permit have been completed, and all fees have been paid. No construction shall commence until after a land use permit has been issued.

SECTION 9.8 ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN SPECIAL LAND USES

Several land uses require additional requirements that must be met in addition to the Standards, Requirements, and Findings in Section 9.3. These additional standards are listed below.

- A. Communication Towers. It is the general purpose and intent of the Township to carry out the will of the United States Congress by authorizing communication facilities needed to operate wireless communication systems. However, it is the further purpose and intent of the Township to provide for such authorization in a manner which will retain the integrity of neighborhoods and the character, property values, and aesthetic quality of the community at large. In fashioning and administering the provisions of this section, an attempt has been made to balance these potentially competing interests.
 - 1. Pursuant to Section 3514 of P.A. 110 of 2006, as amended, wireless communications equipment is a permitted use of property and is not subject to Special Land Use approval or any other approval if the following requirements are met:
 - a. The wireless communications equipment will be collocated on an existing wireless communications support structure or in an existing equipment compound.
 - b. The existing wireless communications support structure or existing equipment compound is in compliance with the Elmwood Township

Zoning Ordinance or was officially approved by the Zoning Administrator or Planning Commission.

- c. The proposed collocation will not do any of the following:
 - i. Increase the overall height of the wireless communications support structure by more than 20 feet or 10% of its original height, whichever is greater.
 - ii. Increase the width of the wireless communications support structure by more than the minimum necessary to permit collocation.
 - iii. Increase the area of the existing equipment compound to greater than 2,500 square feet.
- d. The proposed collocation complies with the terms and conditions of any previous final approval of the wireless communications support structure or equipment compound by the Zoning Administrator or Planning Commission.
- 2. Wireless communications equipment that meets the requirements of subsection 1 (a) and (b) but does not meet the requirements of subsection 1(c) is a permitted use of property if it receives special land use approval.
- 3. The Planning Commission shall take into account the following:
 - a. <u>Visual Impact</u>. The application for special approval for the tower shall include a visual impact analysis, prepared by the applicant, which includes graphic depictions of the anticipated visual appearance of the tower from important vantage points in the surrounding area. Methods used in preparing the analysis shall be reviewed and approved by the Zoning Administrator.

b. Height and Construction.

- A cellular phone or other personal and business communications services antenna tower shall be exempt from building height limits established by zoning district regulations, provided that the tower height shall not exceed the minimum height necessary to serve its intended functions.
- ii. The tower and any ancillary building housing equipment needed for operation of the tower shall not exceed the floor area and height minimally necessary for such equipment, and shall be of a size, type, color, and exterior materials which are aesthetically and architecturally compatible with the surrounding area, and as minimally obtrusive as possible. Landscape screening may be required by the Planning Commission to accomplish screening of ancillary equipment buildings.
- iii. Towers shall be monopole construction with no guy wires.

- c. <u>Lighting</u>. The applicant shall provide documentation of any lighting to be installed on the tower. If tower lighting is required or proposed, the tower may not be approved unless the Planning Commission determines that it will not have a significant adverse impact on properties and residents of the surrounding area.
 - i. The color and intensity of tower lighting required by Federal Communications Commission (FCC), Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) or Michigan Aeronautics Commission (MAC) regulations shall be as unobtrusive as possible and must cause the least disturbance to the surrounding properties.
 - ii. Lighting shall not be strobe lighting or other intermittent white lighting fixtures, unless expressly required by State or federal regulations. Such intermittent lighting shall be alternated with steady red lights at night if acceptable to State or federal regulations.
 - iii. Lighting may consist of a red top light that does not pulsate or blink.
- e. <u>Color</u>. Towers shall be painted so as to be as unobtrusive as possible. The painting of towers in alternate bands of color shall be permitted only if specifically required by Federal Communications Commission (FCC), Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) or Michigan Aeronautics Commission (MAC) regulations. If alternate band painting is required by FCC, FAA, or MAC regulations, the applicant shall provide documentation of such requirements and regulations.
- f. <u>Height</u>. If the height required for the tower to serve its intended function decreases from the installed height due to technological advancement, additional tower installations at other locations, or other factors, the Township may order that the tower be lowered to such decreased minimum height.
- g. <u>Signs</u>. No signs other than signs required pursuant to federal, state or Township ordinance shall be allowed on an antenna or tower or site.
- h. <u>Setback Requirements</u>. The tower shall be set back not less than the distance equal to the height of the tower measured from the base of the tower to all points on each property line.
 - i. The tower and any supporting or appurtenant structures shall be no closer to any building, than the distance equal to the height of the tower measured from its base at grade to its highest point of elevation.
 - ii. The Planning Commission may reduce the required setbacks for towers that are designed to collapse onto themselves. In such a case, a sealed engineers drawing that states the minimum required


setback shall be provided with the special use application. The Township may retain the services of an independent engineer to review the tower design and requested setback. The costs associated with an independent review shall be paid for by the applicant.

- i. <u>FCC/FFA/Other Regulations</u>. The applicant shall provide documentation of conformance with any Federal Communications Commission, Federal Aviation Administration, of Michigan Aeronautics Commission regulations. The tower shall comply with the Michigan Tall Structures Act (P.A. 259 of 1959, as amended).
- j. <u>Use</u>. The owner/operator of the tower shall agree to permit use of the tower by other personal or business communications services providers, including local government agencies, on reasonable terms, so long as such use does not interfere with the owner/operators reasonable use of the tower.
- k. Removal of Abandoned Towers. Any tower that is not in use for a period of twelve (12) consecutive months shall be considered abandoned, and the owner of such tower shall remove the same within one hundred eighty (180) days of receipt of notice from the Township of such abandonment. In addition to removing the tower, the owner shall restore the site to its original condition. Any foundation shall be removed to a minimum depth of five (5) feet below the final grade and site vegetation shall be restored. Failure to remove an abandoned tower within the one hundred eighty (180) day period provided in this subsection shall be grounds for the Township to remove the tower at the owner's expense. The Planning Commission shall require the applicant to file an irrevocable bond equal to the reasonable cost (including adjustment for inflation) of removing the tower and attendant accessory structures as a condition of a special use permit given pursuant to this section.
- 1. Antenna Co-location on an existing tower or structure.
 - i. No antenna or similar sending/receiving devices appended to a tower, following its approved construction, shall be permitted if it exceeds the engineered design capacity of the tower thereby jeopardizing the tower's structural integrity.
 - ii. The installation and/or operation of the above mentioned, antennas or facilities shall not interfere with normal radio/television reception in the area. In the event interference occurs, it shall be the sole responsibility of the owner to rectify the situation with the parties involved.

B. Essential Services

1. **Intent**. It is the intent of this Ordinance to allow routine essential services in any zoning district as a permitted use since routine essential services are likely to have a minimal adverse impact on surrounding properties.

Section 5 – Goals and Objectives

The Goals and Objectives for recreation in Elmwood Township were developed together with the Parks and Recreation Committee utilizing public input, noting the existing condition of recreational facilities, conducting a resource inventory, and assessing forecasted demographics and population changes.

GOAL #1

Continue to improve Greilickville Harbor Park as a diverse, multi-generational, universally accessible, and sustainable recreation facility that serves the local population, the Grand Traverse region, and visitors.

Action Objectives:

- a. More safe and efficient parking nearby
- b. Enhance Physical and Cooperative Connections with Discovery Center and Discovery Pier
- c. Landscape plantings along M-22 (Streetscape / Corridor Beautification)
- d. New picnic tables or benches along Brewery Creek
- e. Beach enhancement / expansion where permitted
- f. Kayak/Canoe Launch/Scuba diving staging area
- g. Develop BATA bus stop, park & ride, and bike lockers at Brewery Creek Natural Area
- b. Refine staffing, maintenance, and budgeting process for Capital Improvement Plan input
- i. Boardwalk with interpretive / historical signage at Brewery Creek
- j. Safe access across M-22
- k. Consider allowing commercial activity, such as food trucks, in the park
- l. Plant additional edible vegetation
- m. Enhance existing signage around the facility

GOAL #2

Create and enhance the system of corridors to improve connectivity between the parks, trails, and greenways system, which will provide universal access between existing and potential Township recreation facilities, including Greilickville Harbor Park, the DeYoung Natural Area, and the Cherry Bend Community Park.

Action Objectives:

- a. Provide a connection to the TART Trail from Cherry Bend Community Park; sidewalks along Cherry Bend from M-22 to Cherry Bend Community Park
- b. Strengthen the existing "access easement" through the Brewery Creek Natural Area property from the Leelanau Trail to Greilickville Harbor Park
- c. Connect Leelanau Trail through the Rotary Charities property (Discovery Center ~ Great Lakes complex) and Greilickville Harbor Park
- d. Conduct a feasibility study to someday connect TART Trail to the Timberlee Resort Area (partially completed in 2009 by the DCGL and Gosling Czubak Engineering)
- e. Support efforts to determine possible future connections to the Hickory Hills Recreation and Ski area to Elmwood Township
- f. Support Township's Greilickville Commercial Corridor Task Force's efforts to work with the Discovery Center ~ Great Lakes Board of Directors, TART (Leelanau Trail), the Leelanau Conservancy, the Leelanau County Road Commission, and MDOT to develop and refine conceptual plans for targeted trail links and off-site parking
- g. Consider opportunity for bicycle "commuters" to utilize the M-22 corridor north-south from the broader county and township into Traverse City
- h. Implement barrier-free accessibility as a design standard for all new facilities and improvements to existing facilities

GOAL #3

Make improvements to Cherry Bend Park in the same spirit that Greilickville Harbor Park has been redeveloped to provide a diverse, multi-generational, universally accessible and sustainable recreation facility and optimizes the available park land, links to nearby neighborhoods, Cedar Creek Commons and the Leelanau Trail, and provides desired 4-season active and passive recreation.

Action Objectives:

- a. Better connectivity to Leelanau/TART Trail and neighborhoods and Cedar Creek
- b. Design, fund and implement a walking pathway circuit in the park
- c. Encourage Winter activities such as ice skating rink, etc.
- d. Consider Wayfinding (I.e. Context Map) and Informational Signage (I.e. Park Rules)
- e. Improve site lighting
- f. Small pavilion for shade/picnicking near the ballfields
- g. Trees under-planting, replacement, enhancement
- b. Consider irrigation for use areas
- i. Expand park to the west (Overflow grass parking for events)
- j. Refine staffing, maintenance and budgeting process for Capital Improvement Plan input
- k. Evaluate and Plan for Brewery Creek property enhancements.
- l. Develop an overall Township Trail Plan
- m. Consider additional park equipment for different age groups as well as abilities
- n. Consider additional facilities to create multi-generational park, including pickleball courts.
- o. Review park facilities and consider additional facilities to make the park more of a 4-season park

GOAL #4

Investigate and study possible parcels, which may be considered for future recreation land acquisition through the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) and/or partnerships with the Leelanau Conservancy or Leelanau Brownfield Redevelopment Authority (LCBRA) to establish public private cooperative projects and/or permanent conservation easements, recreational amenities, or facilities.

With a quick look at the Township's Recreational Inventory (<u>Appendix 1</u>), it is evident that the southern portion of Elmwood Township contains many of the Township's recreational facilities. There has been documented public interest in identifying and studying opportunities to create and enhance possible future recreational opportunities in the western and northern portions of the Township, including seeking to purchase available and appropriate land. The principal purposes stated for such land acquisition include provision of additional non-motorized recreational trails for passive recreation, and/or natural resource and wildlife habitat conservation and protection.

Action Objectives:

- a. Investigate Timberlee Resort "hilltop" natural recreational easement
- b. Investigate other west-Township natural parcels
- c. Support efforts to investigate conservation/recreation areas near Lakeview Hills Road (n. Elmwood/S. Bingham Twp. Line)
- d. Map undeveloped properties adjacent to existing facilities
- e. Investigate additional properties to enhance wildlife corridors, including but not limited to properties along Brewery Creek

GOAL #5

Work with the Township Marina Committee to develop and implement recommendations to improve the joint asset of the Elmwood Township Marina and support amenities that are to be
