I believe this is the smart, efficient, effective, and thoughtful way to go about putting together a resolution that comes with centuries of historical context behind it. I am appalled however by the suggestion from two commissioners that you include wording about "a high percentage of African Americans who abort their unborn babies". Never have I heard something so not-related to the subject matter. I would be curious to see what their "suggestions" are to include this unrelated topic in the resolution. I feel they can have their own views on the subject, but a county document should not say anything about a subject so controversial (and so unrelated) such as abortion. If something related to abortion is included, I feel it would attract unwanted and widespread media attention. I would guess it could even negatively impact commerce and tourism in the county. I also appreciate the term "social justice", and don't agree that it is grounded in a particular idealogical perspective.

It was heartbreaking to read the comments from the former Road Commissioner, but was glad when I read he resigned. These comments have no place in our communities. I am glad people are finally speaking out and standing up to people such as this man.
