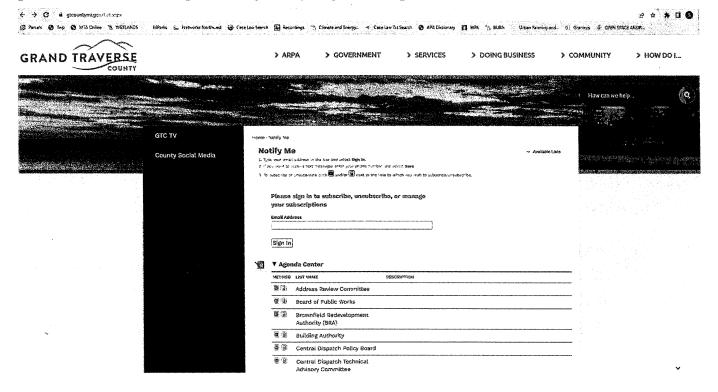

One can sign up for these alerts by following the below steps.

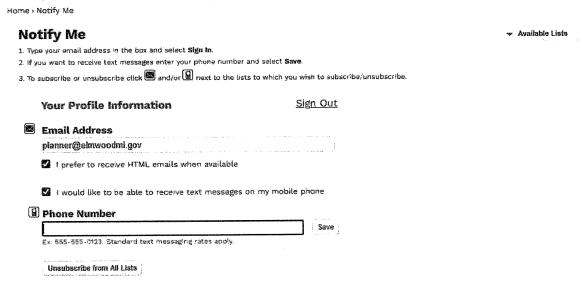

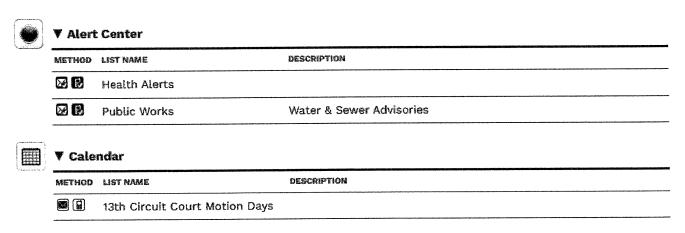

Harbormaster Report

Our 2023 summer has been busy with most weekends filled to capacity and the parking lot filled. We have been running comparable to 2019. The work on the north wall is completed and the dinghy launch area will be done by month's end.

We have been repairing docks as needed and the finger piers on A-dock listed in your packet are going to need repair or replacing depending on the board's decision. C-dock continues to need minor plumbing repairs and I've had to order parts for the lighting pedestals. As we replace bulbs on all three docks, we are upgrading to LED lights. The breakers are wearing out more and the water fixtures are replaced as they wear out as well.

We have moved over to Michigan Broadband for our internet and phone service. We will be looking into who to retain for servicing the cameras and Wi-Fi points on the docks. I have talked to a few boaters who are still experiencing difficulties on reception which I think can be contributed to the hardware we use over the service to the road.

We need rates for 2023/2024 winter storage. We are seeing more interest in winter storage and expect a decent number of boaters to return this winter from previous years. Our greatest advantage is that we can store tall boats and mast-up sailing vessels saving people large expenses in removing masts and lowering tall points on their boats.

My hat's off to supervisor Jeff Shaw who picked up some stranded teenagers in rough water near RED-8 this past Saturday afternoon who had capsized their sailboat and lost the rudder. Jeff told me that he had been observing the kids and when he saw them in trouble from his boat he pulled anchor and headed over to help. This type of action saves lives and makes our community safer.

We will be saying goodbye to our college age workers this month and we should be ok through the end of the season with those who are remaining.

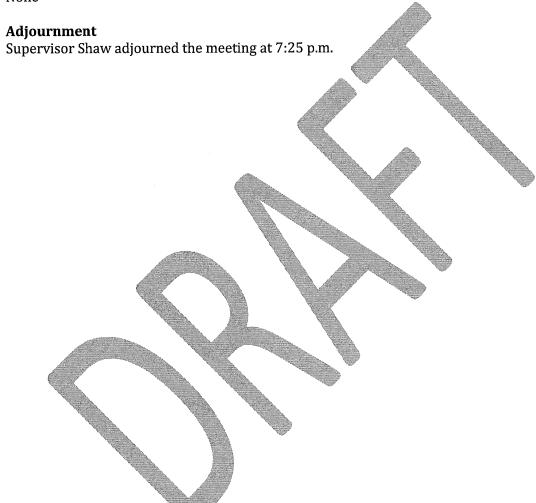

Hi Jeff,

Last week I attended a meeting with Jamie Wade of EGLE, John Divozzo with GTCDPW, and Jennifer Hodges with GFA(GTCDPW & Garfield Twp Engineer) to discuss the concept of Timberlee utilizing equipment from Garfield Township that is being decommissioned. Here is where we are at so far:

- Garfield Twp has 3 hydropneumatic tanks that would be suitable for the Timberlee system and would be an improvement over the existing 15,000 main hydropneumatic tank currently in place.
- The Garfield tanks have not been recently inspected, but are believed to be in excellent condition. Tanks should be inspected by a certified tank inspection company prior to moving forward with any purchase of a tank. Inspections are anticipated to be around \$2500 per tank.
- Since all equipment has the original manufacturer's tag, recertification will not be necessary unless there are structural or other significant deficiencies noted in the tank inspection.
- Total tank size required is a gross volume of at least 10 times the largest pump. Currently this would be 4,250 gallons based on the largest well pump of 425 gpm. If we add a VFD to reduce the maximum pumping rate, the tank size would be 10x the reduced rate. This is where a careful review of the proposed pump cycle time is needed to ensure we don't short cycle similar to the Cottonwood Booster Station.
- Garfield Twp will look into the salvage value of their tanks and any other ancillary equipment that Timberlee
 may be able to utilize. Some equipment may not be available for immediate removal based on Garfield's
 anticipated decommissioning schedule.
- EGLE was a part of this discussion but no decision or approvals were made during the meeting. EGLE's preferred solution is to change to a gravity storage system, however, given the high cost to a limited customer base, this can be considered a hardship. While not the preferred solution, replacing the old tank with a newer, properly rated tank is considered an overall improvement to the system. Jamie said he would take this into consideration during his permit review.

I will update you again when we hear back on the costs for the used equipment.

The long-term management plan shall include provisions, including periodic inspection, removal of trash and debris, and control of invasive species. The long-term management plan shall provide for development of a plan(s) to address and resolve issues, including coordination with EGLE.
- 7. A meeting shall be held with contractor to review the EGLE permit conditions and limitations, prior to the commencement of the permitted activities.
- 8. To prevent the spread of invasive species, equipment shall be washed prior to arrival at a new location and when traveling from an area dominated by invasive species to an area not dominated by invasive species within the same route. Soils, organic matter, and all plant material shall be removed from the equipment, including the undercarriage.
- 9. No work shall be done in the basins during periods of above-normal water levels, except as necessary to prevent erosion.
- 10. Prior to excavation, a siltation barrier must be installed to enclose the area of disturbance, prevent the discharge of sediment suspended in water through the outlet structure. The barrier must be adequately supported on posts, or inflowing or deep water supported by floatation and anchoring devises. The barrier must be construction of vinyl, geotextile or other material designed for siltation control and waterbody use. The structure must extend from the water surface to the bottom and completely enclose the area of disturbance during excavation. The siltation barrier must be regularly monitored and maintained ensure its effectiveness, until excavation is completed, and any water is clear of suspended sediment. Upon project completion, the accumulated materials shall be removed and disposed of at an upland site. The siltation barrier shall then be removed in its entirety and the area restored to its original configuration and with native cover.
- 11. In the event there is a problem with the siltation barrier and a failure to contain the sediments from leaving the project site, the project shall be immediately stopped, evaluated, and appropriate measures shall be taken to stop the release of sediments/turbidity. The permittee, agent or contractor shall immediately notify the Pollution Emergency Alerting System (PEAS) at 1-800-292-4706 and EGLE representative at 231-383-5952 or by email at SchmidtR1@michigan.gov on the siltation barrier failure and the measures being taken to stop the release of sediments/turbidity.
- 12. The permittee shall endeavor to collect and relocate all amphibians, reptiles and other wildlife from the permitted impact areas and excavated material, then relocate them to the immediately adjacent wetland and stream areas, outside the permitted work areas.
- 13. The existing scrub-shrub vegetation along the edge of the basin and the upland must be maintained along a minimum of 50 percent of length of each stormwater basin.
- 14. Upon completion of the excavation, the basins shall be reseeded with wetland species native to Michigan within 30 days after the completion of the excavation. If winter conditions prevent effective seeding, final seeding shall be done when weather conditions allow in the following spring.
- 15. If mulch blankets are required for stabilization, due to the presence of amphibians and reptiles, only biodegradable, leno weave blanket materials are authorized for use.
- 16. All dredge spoils shall be taken to Glen's Landfill for disposal. If required, any on-site decant water shall be directed back to the stormwater basin, with the discharge structure enclosed with siltation barrier, as described in the previous condition.

- 17. The permittee is advised of other potential requirements and legal liabilities under other statutes for placement of dredge material on upland and is responsible for compliance with all applicable local, state, and federal regulations. - 18. Disposal of materials into the wetland is not authorized by this permit under Part 303, Wetlands Protection, of NREPA.
- 19. Construction pads, haul roads, temporary structures, or other structural appurtenances to be placed on or over bottomlands and /or wetlands are not authorized by this permit and shall not be constructed unless authorized by separate permit or permit revision granted in accordance with applicable law.
- 20. This permit shall be kept posted at the work site in a prominent location at all times for the duration of the project, or until its expiration, and authorizes representatives of the EGLE to enter upon said property in order to inspect project progress.
- 21. If permittee or any of their agents have questions pertaining to this permit or conditions, they shall contact the undersigned EGLE official for clarification.

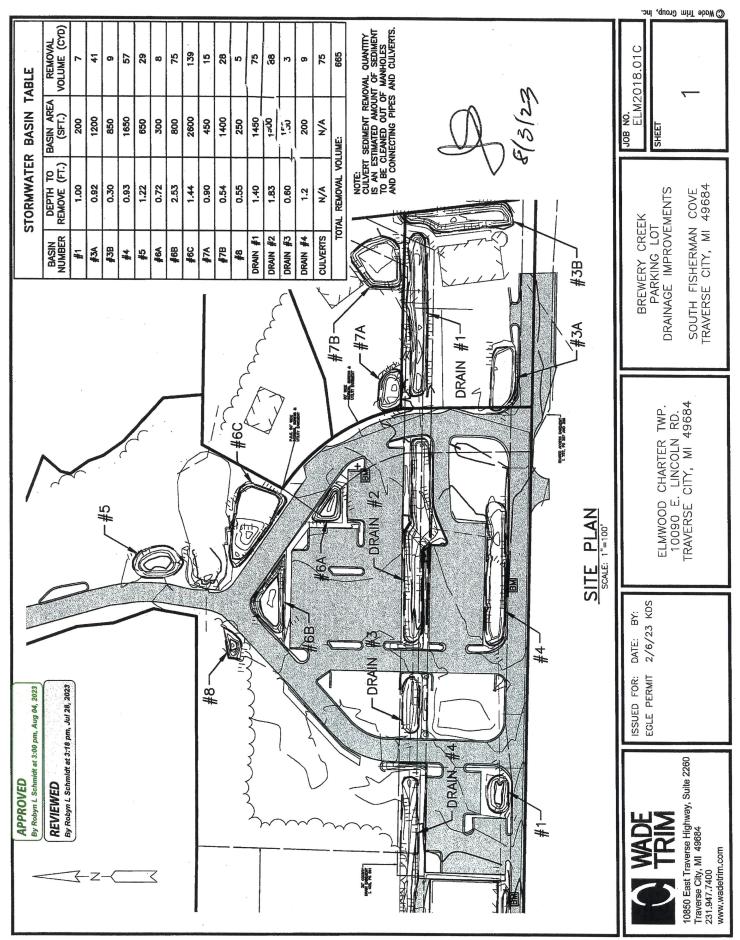

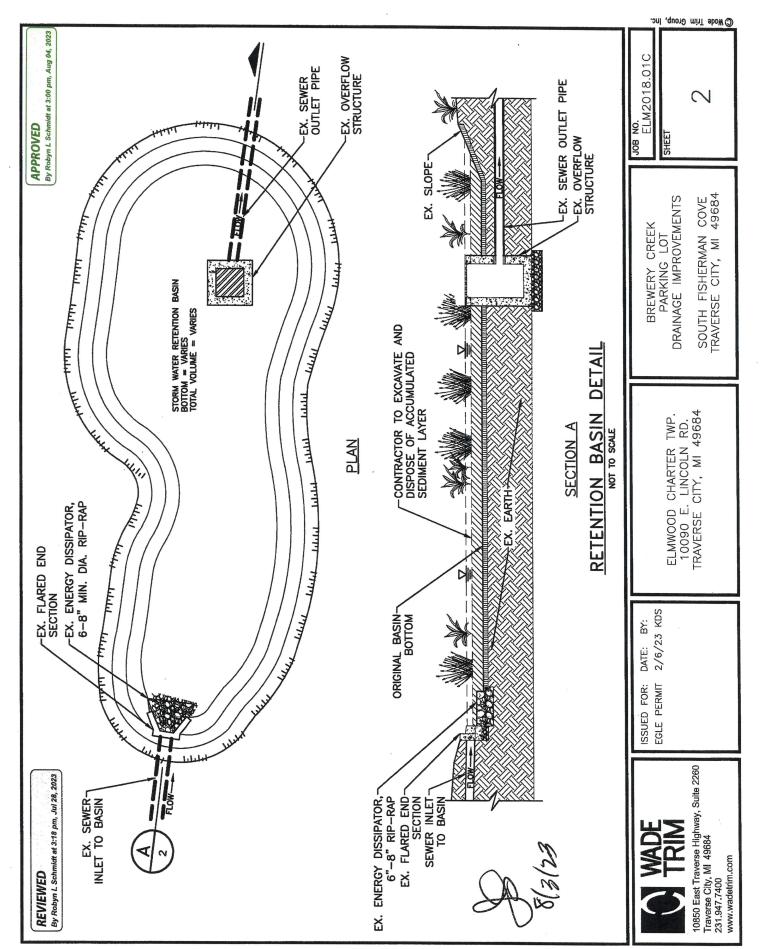

Re: BUDGET AMENDMENT FOR NEEDED BUILDING REPAIRS/IMPROVEMENTS

I am seeking the Township Board's support through a budget amendment for additional funds to complete several building repairs and improvement projects.

BACKGROUND

EFD moved into its existing building the winter of 2000/2001. Growing from a paid-on call response to staffing daytime positions, to our current 24/7, full-time operation. The impact of time and use on the building and its systems, despite our regular care and maintenance, has led to several issues needing attention. Those issues include (in no particular order):

- Leaking showers/damaged ceramic tiles (water is leaking under walls into hallways and carpeted areas)
- Floor tiles pealing and cracking
- · Worn and discolored carpeting
- Walls in need of patch and paint
- Station alerting system (paging and speakers) outdated, unintelligible and in need of upgrade/replacement
- Light switches and exterior fixtures in need of repair/replacement due to wear

CURRENT ACTIONS

Lt. Sokolnicki was tasked with obtaining quotes for the two projects that held the highest priority: the leaking showers, and the station alerting system. The showers were selected to prevent further damage, and it was felt they should be fixed before repairing or replacing any floor tiles and carpeting. The station alerting system was chosen because of the necessity for clear and improved notification throughout the station.

Lt. Sokolnicki's recommendations on the projects and quotes are attached to this memo.

\$20,000 was budgeted by the fire department in 2023 for building, additions, and improvements. That amount however, appears it will be easily exceeded based solely on the estimate for the showers. Because of that, I am requesting additional funding to not only deal with the leaking shower issue, but to keep moving forward on the other projects, some of which are part of the Township's Capital Improvement Plan.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. The Township Board increase the fire department's budgeted amount for buildings, additions and improvements from \$20,000 to \$40,000.
- 2. The fire department complete the lighting and other incidental projects through its building maintenance budget, shored up by the any remaining funds from buildings, additions, and improvements.
- 3. The Township and fire department develop a plan and budget for the replacement of floor tile and carpet in 2024.

RE: Bathroom and Station Alerting System Quotes

Bathrooms:

As you are aware, each of the bathroom shower stalls leak from the stall into the hallways. The men's shower stalls have not only leaked into the hallways, but the infiltration by water into non-watertight areas has resulted in tiles coming loose from the walls, drywall damage, and mold. The damage is significant.

We have been in contact with several entities to address this problem (general contractors, tile retailers, and contractors who work on bathrooms). Four of the eight contractors we contacted have been out to view the damage. We have received one quote for the work; we are waiting on a quote from a second; another stated that he was a solo operator, and the job was too big for him; and the fourth will be out a second time (scheduled for this week) to run some tests with the drain and plumbing to ensure that the issue is not a plumbing issue.

In each case, the recommendation is to raze the existing shower stalls, remediate any damage to the internal structure of the walls and rebuild the stalls ensuring a waterproof seal this time.

The bid we have received is \$24,885.69 and is attached to this memo.

I recommend planning to gather the funding to pay for this project and, once we have three quotes, moving forward quickly with the repair to resolve any health/safety issues there may be and to eliminate any further damage due to the current condition of the showers.

Alerting System:

As you are aware, the station speaker system sound quality is poor to the extent that it is often difficult to understand what is being said by Dispatch. Since we have begun full-time operations in the station, it has become evident that the current system is not up to the task of alerting personnel properly (no coverage in the bathrooms, the workout area upstairs, and what are now the bedrooms).

Upgrading the system using new speakers, additional speakers, and lighting to assist in alerting members during sleeping hours should be initiated.

We have been in contact with three entities to gather bids for updating the system. All three visited the station to discuss the upgrade we are looking for. We have received two bids (both attached to this memo). The third entity did not submit a bid (we have requested the bid more than once).

Of the two bids received, I recommend the lower, not only because of the significant difference in pricing. The low bidder was prompt in providing both a visit to the station and the bid. The low bidder also installed the system at GLFD. I have witnessed how the system operates there and had discussions with GLFD's Chief and a Lieutenant regarding the system. The higher bid also has several other items listed that would require further work and expense that is not detailed in the quote, making the cost even greater than the quote.

Re: A Dock Finger Piers

Greetings Pete,

Per your request, this document addresses the repair or replacement of two 3' x 38' finger piers on A Dock that have become wobbly. Given your report that the upper flotation encasement steel remains in good condition, we feel reskinning the subject units *is* a viable option. Replacement pricing is also provided for consideration.

Although I believe you're familiar with the reskinning process, I feel it's appropriate to provide an explanation of the same since Elmwood Township may have experienced personnel changes in recent years. To that mission, please note the following:

Reskinning Explained

Our docks are constructed with upper and lower galvanized sheet steel membranes that sandwich a timber framework – all voids of which are occupied by polystyrene flotation material. The sheet steel used (by specification) primarily serves automotive and culvert industries, but unfortunately not all material under this specification was produced equally during the era of A Dock's fabrication. Fortunately, specifications and applied techniques have vastly improved since that timeframe, and we have not seen (nor do we expect to see) any reoccurrence of the subject issue.

The sheet steel membranes serve a dual purpose; they not only provide encasement and protection for the floatation material, but more importantly serve an integral function in accepting and dissipating all imposed forces. Although a dock section whose lower membrane has been compromised will continue to function without any adverse visible affects, the structural capacity will be impacted.

Such an occurrence is easily noticeable on finger piers, observed by an increasing loss of stability as the subject material deteriorates. That said, it's appropriate to mention that many new commercial floating dock structures fail to produce a level of stability that matches even our "wounded" decades-old units. Be that as it may, we acknowledge that stable finger piers are expected from our design and we therefore recommend replacement of the bottom skin when this issue arises.

Head piers with damaged or missing bottom sheet steel do not demonstrate the same instability as finger piers. However, this damage *does* pose a structural issue since they're designed to accommodate the loads imposed by finger piers, boats, and anchorage. Accordingly, compromised heads pier sections are more prone to failure in harsh conditions. It's generally cost prohibitive to reskin head piers due to the presence of heavy utilities, so we recommend continually monitoring this portion of dockage to identify any potential issues.

The process of replacing finger pier lower sheet steel generally adheres to the following:

- 1. Disconnect affected dock sections, float to launch ramp, and remove from water.
- 2. Roll finger piers onto their sides and remove any remaining sheet steel / nails.
- 3. Install new continuous full-length runs of sheet steel, fastened to framing on 1 ½" centers.
- 4. Return finger pier to water, float back into place, then reconnect.
- 5. Note: All electrical cable (if applicable) must be removed in advance of our arrival.

There's considerable time variability associated with this task depending on how easily the existing material can be removed, so we always **estimate** this work with a price range. Polystyrene can often be reused, which I'm optimistic is the case for these finger piers. That said, there's a potential for additional (minor) expense beyond what is stated herein. For this reason, it's appropriate to clarify that invoicing would actually be calculated on a time and materials basis.

Your cost for this effort should fall somewhere between \$9,000 and \$10,000, which is premised on the following qualifications:

- 1. Elmwood Twp. will provide a 15-yard dumpster onsite for disposal of removed material.
- 2. All work will be authorized to commence directly at the launch ramp.
- 3. A portion of Elmwood's launch ramp must be closed throughout the duration of work, and FDS will be afforded uninterrupted use at no expense.
- 4. Reasonable cleanup is included, but marina staff may be required to assist if thorough / detailed efforts are required.

Replacement Option

- \geq 2 3' x 38' Finger piers with approximate 22" freeboard.
- > Decking to be Clear & Better pressure treated SYP, fastened with screw-shank nails.
- ➤ 6" x 6" Vertical timber fenders and 10" aluminum cleats at appropriate locations.
- > Safety ladders are not currently included.
- > Any appurtenance to be reused (i.e. dock boxes) must be removed prior to our arrival.
- Pricing assumes new connection ears must be site welded to head pier plates.
- > Removal of existing fingers is *not* included (see Disposal Option below).
- > Delivery, offloading, and turnkey installation are included.
- As with reskinning, uninterrupted and no-cost use of Elmwood's launch ramp is assumed.
- > Total price: \$17,600.00

Disposal Option

- > Existing finger piers would be disconnected and hauled offsite for disposal.
- > Environmental efforts (i.e. shrink-wrapping) are not included and assumed to be unnecessary.
- Pricing is contingent upon approval of Replacement Option.
- > Total price: \$2,100.00

Note: We assume a Leelanau County building permit and EGLE / USACE permits are not required for this project. All permitting efforts shall be the responsibility of others if this assumption is determined to be incorrect.

Upon your review of the above, I'll be happy to address any thoughts or questions you may have. Please be advised that the remainder of our 2023 schedule is fully committed. Reskinning efforts are best completed in the fall due to the "messy" nature of this work, however the replacement option could be scheduled for spring of 2024. We sincerely appreciate your continued interest in FDS, and look forward to hearing back at your convenience.

Ordinance No. 1 of 2018

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF EAST BAY ORDAINS:

Ordinance No. 1-14, the following definition is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

A. Section 3: Definitions

"Sidewalk" means all cement, asphalt, concrete, and other improved walkways that are located within the right-of-way of the US 31 corridor or otherwise adjacent to the US 31 corridor between Holiday Road to Avenue B or located

adjacent to the US 31 corridor between Holiday Road to Avenue B or located upon lots that abut this highway corridor and are intended for use by the general public for pedestrian travel.

public for pedestrian travel.

- B. Section 4, A:
 It shall be the duty of the owner of all lots within the Township located within the right-of- way and are intended for use by the general public for pedestrian travel,
 - to maintain the sidewalks adjacent to or upon their lots in reasonable repair so that they are reasonably safe and convenient for public travel.
- C. Section 6: Closure of Sidewalks

All sidewalks within the Township located within the right- of-way shall be closed to the public between November 1 and May 1 each year and at any other time deemed necessary by the Township Board, or township official designated by the Township Board. Any person using a sidewalk during the time the sidewalk is closed shall do so at his or her own risk. The Township shall erect signs on all sidewalks sufficiently legible to be seen by an ordinarily observant person giving notice of the sidewalk closings. When sidewalks are closed temporarily by action of the Township Board, or township official designated by the Township Board, the Township shall erect signs or barriers giving notice of the temporary sidewalk closing.

This Ordinance amendment shall become effective thirty (30) days after its publication.

The estimated date work is to be substantially completed is not a definite completion date and time is not of the essence. In the event the work is delayed through no fault of TKS, TKS shall have such additional time for performance as may be reasonably necessary under the circumstances. Subscriber agrees to pay TKS the sum of \$1,000 per day for each business day the work is re-scheduled or delayed by Subscriber or others engaged by Subscriber or others engaged by Subscriber or other contractors engaged by Subscriber and through no fault of TKS on less than 24 hour notice to TKS. If installation is delayed for more than one year from date hereof by Subscriber or other contractors engaged by Subscriber and through no fault of TKS, Subscriber agrees to pay an additional 5% of the contract Purchase Price upon installation. Subscriber assumes all risk of loss of material once delivered to the job site. Should TKS be required by existing or hereafter enacted law to perform any service or furnish any material not specifically covered by the terms of this agreement Subscriber agrees to pay TKS for such service or material.
- 15. TESTING OF SECURITY SYSTEM: The parties hereto agree that the security equipment, once installed, is in the exclusive possession and control of the Subscriber, and it is Subscriber's sole responsibility to test the operation of the security equipment and to notify TKS if any equipment is in need of repair. Service, if provided, is pursuant to paragraphs 4 and 7. TKS shall not be required to service the security equipment to the best of its ability within 36 hours, exclusive of Saturday, Sunday and legal holidays, during the business hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Subscriber agrees to test and inspect the security equipment and to advise TKS of any defect, error or omission in the security equipment. In the event Subscriber complies with the terms of this agreement and TKS fails to repair the security equipment within 36 hours after notice is given, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, Quipment is in need of repair to TKS, in writing, by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, and Subscriber shall not be responsible for payments due while the security equipment remains inoperable. - 21. EXCULPATORY CLAUSE: TKS and Subscriber agree that TKS is not an insurer and no insurance coverage is offered herein. The security system, equipment, and TKS' services are designed to detect and reduce certain risks of loss, though TKS does not guarantee that no loss or damage will occur. TKS is not assuming liability, and, therefore, shall not be liable to Subscriber or any other third party for any loss, economic or non-economic, business loss or interruption, consequential damages, in contract or tort, data corruption or inability to retrieve data, personal injury or property damage sustained by Subscriber or others as a result of equipment failure, human error, burglary, theft, hold-up, fire, smoke, water or any other cause whatsoever, regardless of whether or not such loss or damage was caused by or contributed to by TKS' breach of contract, negligent performance to any degree in furtherance of this agreement, any extra contractual or legal duty, strict products liability, or negligent failure to perform any obligation pursuant to this agreement or any other legal duty, except for gross negligence and willful misconduct.
- 22. INSURANCE / ALLOCATION OF RISK: Subscriber shall maintain a policy of Comprehensive General Liability and Property Insurance for liability, casualty, fire, theft, and property damage under which Subscriber is named as insured and TKS is named as additional insured and which shall on a primary and non-contributing basis cover any loss or damage TKS' services are intended to detect to one hundred percent of the insurable value or potential risk. The parties intend that the Subscriber assume all potential risk and damage that may arise by reason of failure of the equipment, system or TKS' services and that Subscriber will look to its own insurance carrier for any loss or assume the risk of loss. IF SUBSCRIBER WISHES TO INCREASE TKS' AMOUNT OF LIMITATION OF LIABILITY, SUBSCRIBER MAY, AS A MATTER OF RIGHT, AT ANY TIME, BY ENTERING INTO A SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT, OBTAIN A HIGHER LIMIT BY PAYING AN ANNUAL PAYMENT CONSONANT WITH TKS' INCREASED LIABILITY. - SUBSCRIBER ACKNOWLEDGES THAT THIS AGREEMENT CONTAINS EXCULPATORY CLAUSE, INDEMNITY, INSURANCE, ALLOCATION OF RISK AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY PROVISIONS.
- 24. LEGAL ACTION / BREACH / LIQUIDATED DAMAGES / AGREEMENT TO BINDING ARBITRATION: The parties agree that due to the nature of the services to be provided by TKS, the payments to be made by the Subscriber for the term of this agreement form an integral part of TKS' anticipated profits; that in the event of Subscriber's default it would be difficult if not impossible to fix TKS' actual damages. SUBSCRIBER MAY BRING CLAIMS AGAINST TKS ONLY IN SUBSCRIBER'S INDIVIDUAL CAPACITY, AND NOT AS A CLASS ACTION PLAINTIFF OR CLASS ACTION MEMBER IN ANY PURPORTED CLASS OR REPRESENTATIVE PROCEEDING. ANY DISPUTE BETWEEN THE PARTIES OR ARISING OUT OF THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING ISSUES OF ARBITRABILITY, SHALL, AT THE OPTION OF ANY PARTY, BE DETERMINED BY BINDING AND FINAL ARBITRATION BEFORE A SINGLE ARBITRATOR ADMINISTERED BY ARBITRATION SERVICES INC., ITS SUCCESSORS OR ASSIGNS, PURSUANT TO ITS ARBITRATION SERVICES INC. AND NOT THE FEDERAL ARBITRATION ACT, EXCEPT THAT NO PUNITIVE OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES MAY BE AWARDED. The arbitrator shall be bound by the terms of this agreement, and shall on request of a party, conduct proceedings by telephone, video, submission of papers or in-person hearing. By agreeing to this arbitration provision the parties are waiving their right to a trial before a judge or jury, waiving their right to appeal the arbitration award and waiving their right to participate in a class action. Service of process or



papers in any legal proceeding or arbitration between the parties may be made by First-Class Mail delivered by the U.S. Postal Service addressed to the party's address designated in this agreement, on file with an agency of the state, or any other address provided by the party in writing to the party making service. The parties submit to the jurisdiction and laws of Michigan, except for arbitration which is governed by the FAA and the arbitration rules and agree that any litigation or arbitration between the parties shall be commenced and maintained in the county where TKS' principal place of business is located or Nassau County, New York. The parties waive trial by jury in any action between them unless prohibited by law. Any action between the parties must be commenced within one year of the accrual of the cause of action or shall be barred. All actions or proceedings by either party must be based on the provisions of this agreement. Any other action that Subscriber may have or bring against TKS in respect to other services rendered in connection with this agreement.

Subscriber appoints TKS to act as Subscriber's agent with respect to such third parties, except that TKS shall not obligate Subscriber to make any payments to such third parties. - 27. NON-SOLICITATION: Subscriber agrees that it will not solicit for employment for itself, or any other entity, or employ, in any capacity, any employee of TKS assigned by TKS to perform any service for or on behalf of Subscriber for a period of two years after TKS has completed providing service to Subscriber. In the event of Subscriber's violation of this provision, in addition to injunctive relief, TKS shall recover from Subscriber an amount equal to such employee's salary based on the average three months preceding employee's termination of employment with TKS, times twelve, together with TKS' counsel and expert witness fees.
- 28. FALSE ALARMS / PERMIT FEES / WITNESS FEES: Subscriber is responsible for all alarm permits and fees, agrees to file for and maintain any permits required by applicable law and indemnify or reimburse TKS for any fees or fines relating to permits or false alarms. TKS shall have no liability for permit fees, false alarms, false alarm fines, the manner in which police or fire department responds, or the refusal of the police or fire department to respond. FULL AGREEMENT / SEVERABILITY: This agreement along with the Schedule of Equipment and Services constitute the full understanding of the parties and may not be amended, modified or canceled, except in writing signed by both parties. Subscriber acknowledges and represents that Subscriber has not relied on any representation, assertion, guarantee, warranty, collateral agreement or other assurance, except those set forth in this Agreement. Subscriber hereby waives all rights and remedies, at law or in equity, arising, or which may arise, as the result of Subscriber's reliance on such representation, assertion, guarantee, warranty, collateral agreement or other assurance. To the extent this agreement is inconsistent with any other document or agreement, whether executed prior to, concurrently with or subsequent to this agreement the terms of this agreement shall govern. This agreement shall run concurrently with and shall not terminate or supersede any existing agreement between the parties unless specified herein. Should any provision of this agreement be deemed void, the remaining parts shall be enforceable.

Memorandum of Understanding

The memorandum of understanding on tonight's agenda was submitted to the BPW by the City of Traverse City. According to the BPW council, based on our contract with the City, we are required to pay the detailed amount. The City could technically just send us a bill, but they chose to give us this memorandum to make sure we understand the terms of our contract with them.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF TRAVERSE CITY AND CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF ELMWOOD

WHEREAS, the Parties to this MOU are parties to the Amended and Restated Master Sewer Agreement (2017) dated January 1, 2017 (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Agreement defines the allocation of costs of, and establishes certain rights and responsibilities with respect to, the Wastewater Treatment Plant and appurtenances as well as multi-user facilities such as sewer lines and pumping stations used by more than one party to handle or transport sewage to the Treatment Plant; and

WHEREAS, Paragraph 16 of the Agreement provides that if future costs require financing through debt, the parties shall bear the annual debt service thereon in proportion to their combined owned leased capacity; and

WHEREAS, the City will issue bonds via the State of Michigan's Clean Water State Revolving Fund Program (EGLE Project No. 5745-01) for the purpose of certain projects related to multi-user facilities in the 100 and 200 Blocks of East Front Street, attached hereto as **Attachment A** and incorporated herein by reference. The principal balance of the bonds will be based on final project costs (estimated at \$2,725,000 less \$408,750 of loan forgiveness), the bond period will be 20 years and the interest rate will be 1.875% percent per annum.

NOW THEREFORE,

- 1. The "whereas clauses" of this Agreement are incorporated herein and are to be construed as part of the binding provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 2. Parties. This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MOU") is made and entered into by and between the City of Traverse City, whose address is 400 Boardman Avenue, Traverse City, Michigan 49684, and the Charter Township of Elmwood whose address is 10090 E. Lincoln Rd., Traverse City, MI 49684.
- 3. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this MOU is to set forth the estimated cost of the debt service for the multi-user facilities anticipated and to provide for specific invoicing and payment procedures.
- 4. <u>Term of MOU</u>. This MOU is effective upon the day and date last signed and executed by the duly authorized representatives of the parties to this MOU and the governing bodies of the parties' respective counties or municipalities and shall remain in full force and effect until the debt service has been fully paid and the bonds retired.

- 5. Responsibilities of City. The City shall invoice the Township no less than 30 days prior to the due date for debt service payments, its proportionate share of the debt service.
- 6. Responsibilities of Elmwood Township. The Township shall remit payment on each debt service invoice within thirty (30) days. The proportionate share of the Township's debt service is: 16% x the principal and interest payment due for each debt service payment.

7. General Provisions

- A. Amendments. Either party may request changes to this MOU. Any changes, modifications, revisions or amendments to this MOU which are mutually agreed upon by and between the parties to this MOU shall be incorporated by written instrument, and effective when executed and signed by all parties to this MOU.
- **B.** Applicable Law. The construction, interpretation and enforcement of this MOU shall be governed by the laws of the State of Michigan. Any dispute regarding the interpretation and performance of this MOU shall be subject to the dispute resolution provisions of the Agreement.
- **D.** Conflict with the Agreement. If any term of this MOU is found to conflict with the Agreement, the terms of the Agreement shall control.
- E. Severability. Should any portion of this MOU be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the MOU shall continue in full force and effect, and either party may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.
- 8. <u>Signatures</u>. In witness whereof, the parties to this MOU through their duly authorized representatives have executed this MOU on the days and dates set out below, and certify that they have read, understood, and agreed to the terms and conditions of this MOU as set forth herein.

Townships have reserved the following capacities (including peaking periods) in sewer lines and other facilities used by the Townships and owned by the City as follows:

The City agrees to make available such capacity in its lines and facilities to the extent the usable capacity of existing lines permits. The parties estimate that the usable line capacity of the sewer lines being used by the Townships is 70% of the theoretical capacity of the sewer lines. When that flow is reached or when other problems develop with a given sewer line, the parties concerned agree to open good-faith discussion as to the method of increasing capacity or other methods of remedying the problem, including but not limited to repair, reconstruction, replacement, expansion or addition to such lines.

The City agrees that the Townships may make use of capacity in its sewer lines which exceeds that reserved by the Townships (if there is additional capacity not used by the City) without further payment other than by proportion of flow for the operation and maintenance costs as provided in this agreement.

For purposes of determining the initial proportion of use of the multi-user facilities, the parties agree to the following proportions of use, which shall be effective until new determinations are made in accordance with this agreement:

In such case, the sewer usage charges to be charged may be the higher of the jurisdiction in which the customer is located or the jurisdiction which provides the service. The party providing the service shall be responsible only for the operation and maintenance and not for capital expenditures. The parties agree that customary lateral benefit, benefit and riser fees may be imposed but no such charge shall be imposed which would discriminate unfairly among similarly situated customers.
