Along with other residents of the County, I was shocked by your vote last week to defund the voter-approved millage for early childhood services. I herewith request that you urgently reinstate the planned funding for these essential services and I would like this request to be included in the public record.

Approval of the millage was achieved by democratic vote in our county, indicating voters' consent and support for these vital services. The Board of Commissioners should not unilaterally remove support for these services against the wishes of the voters of Leelanau County. The previously budgeted funding to the Health Department is essential for the provision of early childhood services, for all residents who have young children and wish to avail of this key support.
