
EMS AGENCY UPGRADE



2022 - 2023






MONTHLY CALLS BY TOWNSHIP

A MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

OCTOBER WAS A HISTORIC MONTH FOR CEDAR AREA FIRE & RESCUE. ON OCTOBER 11TH WE COMPLETED OUR FINAL INSPECTION BY THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, BUREAU OF EMS TRAUMA & PREPAREDNESS. THIS INSPECTION LOOKED OVER ALL OF OUR AGENCY DOCUMENTS PERTAINING TO OUR EMS SERVICE OPERATIONS ALONG WITH OUR EQUIPMENT AND APPARATUS READINESS.

W E WERE ISSUED OUR OFFICIAL ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT TRANSPORTING AGENCY LICENSE THE FOLLOWING DAY AND W F. BEGAN OUR OPERATIONS UNDER NEW DESIGNATION. WITH THIS NEW DESIGNATION WE ARE NO LONGER OPERATING UNDER THE BENNETT BILL AS WE HAD BEEN SINCE NOVEMBER 2021.

THE BENNETT BILL WAS ALWAYS A SHORT TERM SOLUTION AS IT IS NOT DESIGNED TO BE A PERMANENT PROGRAM, ONLY A BRIDGE FOR AGENCIES LIKE OURS WITH THE INTENT OF UPGRADING OUR AGENCY FROM BASIC TO ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT. UNDER THE BENNETT BILL WE WERE NOT REQUIRED TO HAVE A PARAMEDIC ON DUTY 24/7/365 AND WE WERE ONLY ABLE TO PROVIDE ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT WHEN A PARAMEDIC WORKING. NOW, UNDER OUR LICENSE WE ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE A PARAMEDIC ON DUTY ALL THE TIME.

WE ARE ABLE TO FULFILL THIS REQUIREMENT DUE TO THE PLANNING AND SUPPORT THAT HAS BEEN PUT INTO PLACE OVER THE LAST FEW YEARS.



THE HIRING OF ADDITIONAL STAFF AND THE TRAINING OF OUR EXISTING STAFF ALONG WITH THE FINANCIAL SUPPORT AFFORDED TO US BY THE COMMUNITY SUPPORTED MILLAGE ADJUSTMENTS HAVE NOW ALL COME TOGETHER AND THE RESULT IS A LEVEL OF EMS SERVICE THAT WE HAVE NEVER BEEN ABLE TO CONSISTENTLY PROVIDE BEFORE. THIS IS TRULY A HISTORIC TIME IN THE HISTORY OF CEDAR AREA FIRE & RESCUE AND CENTRAL LEELANAU COUNTY!
