HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE MONTH



WILDLAND FIRE

ON JULY 10TH MEMBERS FROM CEDAR ALONG WITH OTHERS FROM MABAS DIV. 3701 RESPONDED TO AN AREA SOUTHEAST OF NESSEN CITY FOR A 225 ACRE WILDFIRE. SEVERAL HOMES WERE LOST AS A RESULT OF THE FIRE.

STRUCTURE FIRE

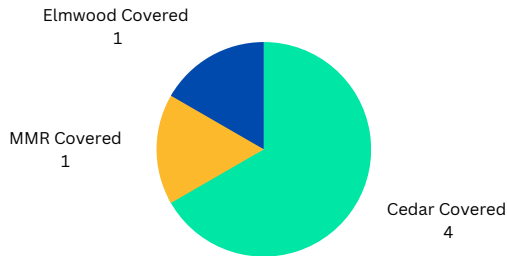
ON JULY 31ST CREWS WERE CALLED TO M-72 NEAR CEDAR VALLEY ROAD FOR A STRUCTURE FIRE. DUE TO REPORTED CONDITIONS A SECOND ALARM WAS CALLED FOR PRIOR TO ARRIVING ON THE SCENE. THE FIRE WAS BROUGHT UNDER CONTROL IN AROUND AN HOUR AND THERE WERE NO INJURIES REPORTED.



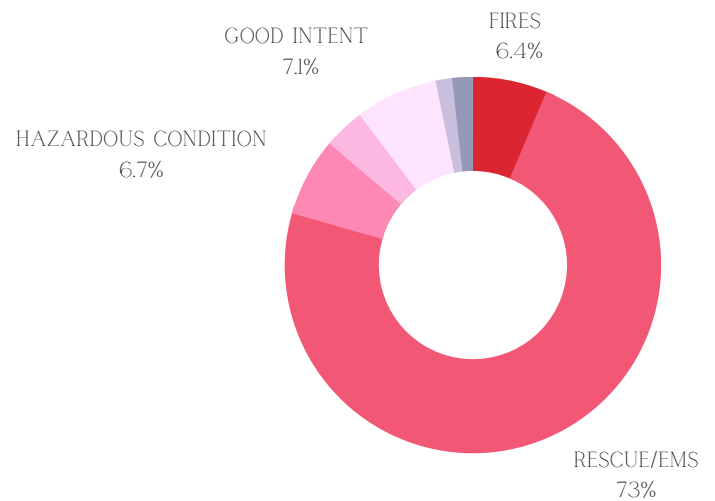

OVERLAPPING CALLS FOR SERVICE

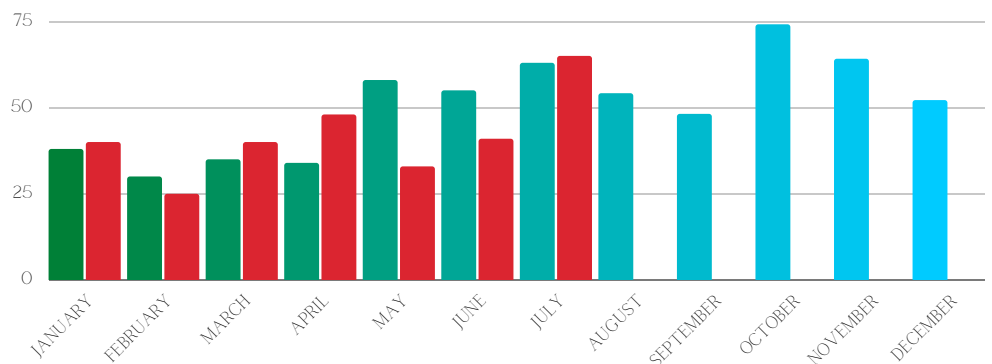


2023 BREAKDOWN BY INCIDENT TYPE

NUMBER OF CALLS BY MONTH 2022 - 2023

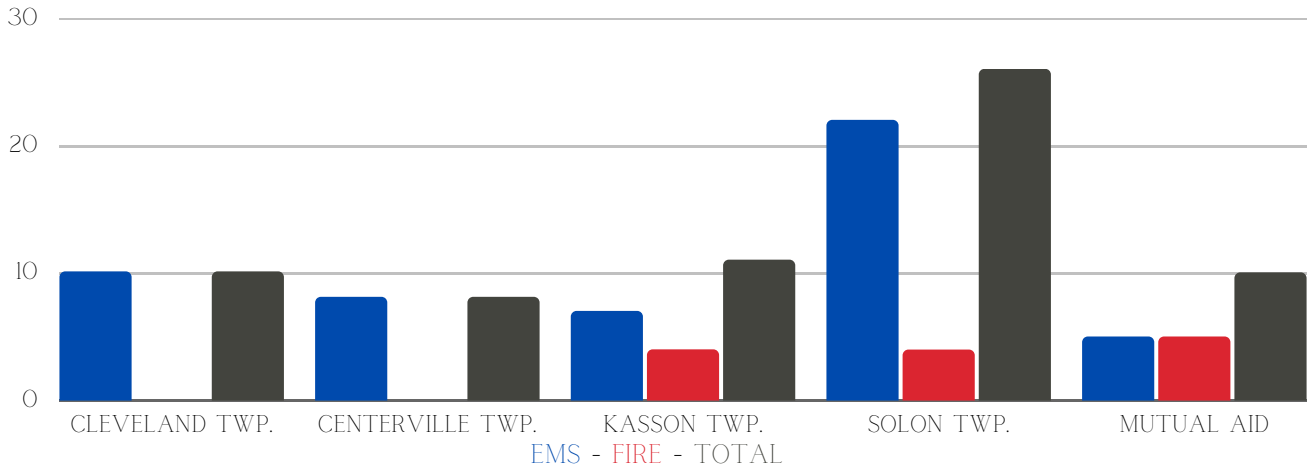

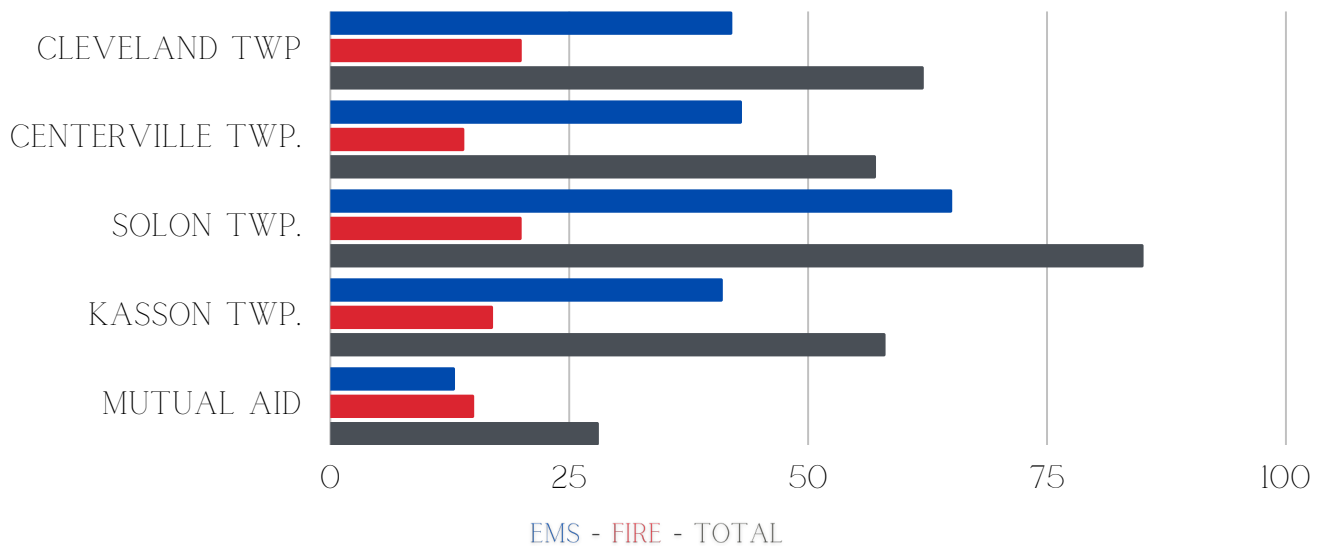
MONTHLY CALLS BY TOWNSHIP

A MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

IT WAS BUSY MONTH AT CEDAR AREA FIRE & RESCUE. JULY WAS OUR BUSIEST MONTH OF CALLS THIS YEAR SO FAR AND AS IS TRUE FOR THE MID SUMMER EVERYONE AROUND US HAS BEEN BUSY ALSO.

THE EARLY PART OF THE MONTH BROUGHT US ANOTHER MABAS RESPONSE TO THE AREA OF NESSEN CITY FOR A LARGE WILDFIRE. WE WERE ABLE TO CALL IN OFF DUTY PERSONNEL SO OUR PARAMEDIC DUTY CREW COULD STAY IN OUR DISTRICT TO RESPOND TO CALLS. WE ENDED UP SENDING THREE MEMBERS WITH OUR BRUSH TRUCK AND UTV TO THE FIRE SCENE AND THEY WORKED FOR AROUND FOUR HOURS IN THEIR DIVISION TO GET THE FIRE UNDER CONTROL. THEY WERE OPERATING ON THE SCENE WITH FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL DEPARTMENTS FROM MANISTEE, BENZIE, WEXFORD AND GRAND TRAVERSE COUNTIES. THE LAST ESTIMATE OF THE FIRE'S FINAL SIZE WAS AROUND 225 ACRES.

TO END THE MONTH WE RESPONDED TO THE AREA OF M-72 AND CEDAR VALLEY ROAD FOR A REPORTED STRUCTURE FIRE. CAFR WAS ABLE TO RESPOND THREE APPARATUS WITH 5 MEMBERS DIRECTLY FROM THE STATION. THIS AIDED IN THE INITIAL OPERATIONS AT THE FIRE WHICH WAS BROUGHT UNDER CONTROL IN AROUND AN HOUR. WE WERE ASSISTED AT THE SCENE BY MMR, LONG LAKE, LELAND, ALMIRA, ELMWOOD, GLEN LAKE AND NORTHPORT.

I WOULD LIKE TO HIGHLIGHT THAT IN JUST THESE TWO INCIDENTS WE HAVE WORKED IN COOPERATION WITH NEARLY



50 DIFFERENT AGENCIES IN THE LAST MONTH TO PROVIDE SERVICE TO OUR REGION. WE ARE VERY FORTUNATE TO BE SURROUNDED BY HIGH PERFORMING DEPARTMENTS WITH EXCEPTIONAL PEOPLE. FOR THE STRUCTURE FIRE WE REQUIRED ASSISTANCE AT I CANT THANK OUR AID PARTNERS ENOUGH. YOU ARE APPRECIATED!
