

Monthly Statistics



TOTAL CALLS FOR SERVICE YEAR-TO-DATE


MONTHLY CALLS BY TOWNSHIP




YEARLY CALLS BY TOWNSHIP

IT WAS A BUSY START TO 2024 FOR OUR MEMBERS. FOUR FIRES, 3 STRUCTURE AND ONE VEHICLE FIRE OCCURRED IN THE FIRST FEW WEEKS OF 2024. THANKFULLY THERE WERE NO INJURIES WITH ANY OF THESE INCIDENTS TO OUR CITIZENS OR FIREFIGHTERS.

ONE OF THE STRUCTURE FIRES WAS IN OUR PRIMARY RESPONSE AREA AND WE WERE ASSISTED BY GLEN LAKE, LELAND AND ALMIRA TOWNSHIP. WHILE THAT INCIDENT WAS BEING HANDLED WE WERE ALSO DISPATCHED FOR A MOTOR VEHICLE CRASH AND AN EMS CALL. ALL OF THESE INCIDENTS HAD AT LEAST TWO DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS ASSISTING US WHICH WE ARE EXTREMELY APPRECIATIVE OF. I'VE SAID IT MANY TIMES IN THE PAST BUT I WOULD LIKE TO CONTINUE TO HIGHLIGHT HOW FORTUNATE WE ARE TO HAVE THE COOPERATION AND WILLINGNESS TO HELP EACH OTHER THAT WE HAVE IN OUR SURROUNDING COMMUNITIES.

WITH ALL OF THE HELP THAT WE RECEIVED FOR OUR INCIDENTS WE WERE ALSO ABLE TO GO UP TO LELAND AND ASSIST THEM WITH AN EARLY MORNING FIRE ON A DAY THE WEATHER CONDITIONS PROVED TO BE A COLD AND ICY CHALLENGE.



THIS MONTH WE ALSO HAD TWO MEMBERS PASS THEIR EMT-B CLASS. P/FF BLAKE VIDOR AND P/FF ZIA YATES BOTH WERE ABLE TO PASS THEIR CLASS TESTING AND RECEIVE THEIR EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN BASIC LICENSES.
