Highlights From The Month




WILDFIRE TIPS FROM THE NFPA: RESEARCH AROUND **HOME DESTRUCTION** VS. **HOME** SURVIVAL IN WILDFIRES POINT TO EMBERS AND SMALL FLAMES AS MAIN WAY THAT MAJORITY OF HOMES IGNITE IN WILDFIRES. EMBERS ARE BURNING PIECES OF AIRBORNE WOOD AND/OR VEGETATION THAT CAN BE CARRIED MORE THAN A MILE BY THE WIND AND CAN CAUSE SPOT FIRES AND IGNITE HOMES, DEBRIS AND OTHER OBJECTS.

MEMBERS FROM CEDAR AND GLEN LAKE WERE JOINED BY REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE LAND CONSERVANCY TO TOUR THE TRAIL SYSTEM ON WHEELER ROAD. THIS CONSISTED OF THE PALMER WOODS PRESERVE AND OTHER TRAILS IN THE AREA.





Annual Call Comparison




TOTAL CALLS FOR SERVICE YEAR-TO-DATE


MONTHLY CALLS BY TOWNSHIP

WE ARE PREPARING FOR AN EARLY WILDFIRE SEASON THAT DEPENDING ON THE WEATHER COULD BE LONGER THAN USUAL. ALSO WITH THE EARLY SPRING WEATHER WE ARE AGAIN GETTING FAMILIARIZED WITH OUR WILDERNESS RECREATIONAL AREAS. WE JOINED WITH GLEN LAKE FIRE TO TRAIN ON THE NEW TRAIL MARKING SYSTEM THAT IS BEING IMPLEMENTED AT THE WHEELER ROAD TRAIL SYSTEM. THIS TRAINING TOOK US ONTO THE TRAILS WITH OUR UTV'S TO ASSESS ACCESS AND EGRESS POINTS ALONG LEARNING THE MARKING SYSTEM. THIS NEW SYSTEM WILL ALLOW US TO MORE QUICKLY AND EFFECTIVELY RESPOND TO THE INCIDENTS THAT WE GET ON THE TRAILS EACH YEAR.
