



Fire Chiefs Report – February 2021

Department Operations

Apparatus:

<u>Training:</u>

CAFR staff completed 206 hours of training last month covering various topics. Members have started the coursework for the upcoming S-130 & S-190 course with the Michigan DNR.

This month Chief Doornbos started the Fire Service Staff & Command program through Eastern Michigan University. This executive fire officer program runs one week per month through October and includes fire service leaders from throughout Michigan.

ALS Updates:

It appears that the mid-summer start date for the paramedic class offered by Munson Healthcare is still on track. This program will be a combination of virtual learning and in-person skills training. Further information will be given as that time nears.
