

Vehicle Auction Draft Motion

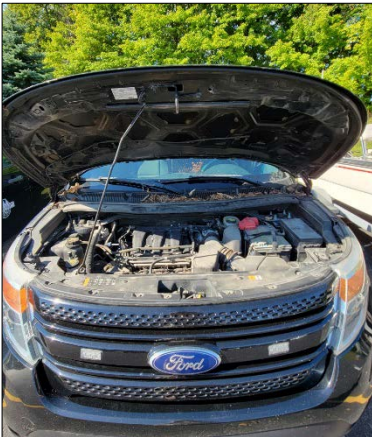
