Parents today want to know when their children are using drugs; often it is not easy to tell and what has become a vaping epidemic with deadly impact—along with the massive deaths of young and old due to opioid, heroin, and fentanyl addiction—what parents need to learn today is critical—the difference in some cases, literally between life and death.

What treatment specialists in the region know, what school counselors know, along with what informed parents and adolescent treatment experts know can serve as a bulwark against developing drug use and addiction among the young.

What experts tell us is that if parents can prevent the use of drugs in children up to the age of 18, the likelihood of their ever using drugs or becoming addicted in their lifetimes, is very low. Young people need to know the importance of being drug-free, and educated parents can make a big difference in raising drug-free children.


