

Village of Northport Vendor, Peddler and Solicitor Ordinance #100-2010

The Village of Northport Ordains:

1.0 Overview

It shall be unlawful for any person/group to vend, peddle, or solicit for the sale of goods, merchandise, wares, charitable contributions/donations, services or any other thing of value from place to place, door to door, or in any public place within the Village of Northport. Legal business conducted on private property shall conform to all State and Federal laws, County and local laws, ordinances, zoning, health department and building codes and permits. Special Events held on public property by non-profits require prior permission of the Northport Village Council or Clerk and are in control of the vendors allowed to participate in said event.

2.0 Definitions

Vendor, peddler, or solicitor: Any person traveling by foot, wagon, vehicle or any other type of conveyance to vend, peddle, or solicit for the sale of goods, merchandise, wares, charitable contribution donations, services or any other thing of value from place to place, door to door, or in any public place

3.0 Penalty/Municipal/Civil Infraction

Any person violating this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$100.00 to \$500.00 as applied by the Northport Village Council. All State, County, and Township laws, ordinances, and policies must be obeyed. Fines will be levied on Village or Township taxes or in accordance with State Law.
