I am deeply concerned about our very beautiful Lake Leelanau. It is the backbone of our economy and tax revenues and its beauty exceeds all others.

The full page color ad on page 10 of the July 1st Leelanau Enterprise is filled with so much misinformation, scare tactics and fear it is hard to know where to start. To all these people hiding in the shadows, I say come forward and tell us who you are and why you are so adamantly opposed to the formation of a LLL Preservation Board.

Has it occurred to many of you who do not pay membership dues to start and join in the fight. Do you know that you can join for as little as \$25/year or name your own amount? Do you realize how much money could be raised for the LLLA if every riparian on the lake only paid \$25 annually in membership dues to them. Then there are all of you on lots that overlook spectacular views of our beautiful lake. Can you also spend a mere \$25 a year and join the LLLA to keep our lake and your view healthy and clean?

The LLLA has for 40 years been fantastic stewards of our beautiful lake. They have contributed their time, talent and expertise as volunteers and members. Over these years they have continually monitored water quality, provided lakeshore protection, boating safety, fishing, and swimmer's itch education and monitoring. They will continue to do these things in the future. So why now have they become the enemy and vilified by some nameless, bitter opposition group?
