This Public Health Order was thoughtfully and thoroughly considered because of the rise of positive cases (reported ones) of COVID in our County and region. Leelanau County is now in a "high" transmission category for community spread of COVID and with the latest Delta variant, it is now affecting children. Hospital admissions for COVID are on a rapid rise and Munson Healthcare has moved to the Orange pandemic response stage (please see below).

Munson Healthcare Moves from Yellow to Orange Pandemic Response Stage

Effective immediately, Munson Healthcare will be elevating our pandemic response stage from Yellow to Orange. This decision was approved by System Clinical Incident Command (SCIC), System COVID Operations Incident Command (SCOIC), and the MHC Executive Team.

Our leadership teams continue to make essential decisions in an effort to slow the spread of COVID-19. Higher positivity rates in the community, an increase in COVID-19 hospitalization rates throughout MHC hospitals, and COVID-19 variants all contributed to this decision.

Below outlines what you need to know as we move back to Orange:

Visitors

- Our <u>Visitation Policy</u> remains at one visitor per patient in a facility at a time with the same exceptions in place for NICU, pediatric, and end-of-life patients.
- MHC cafeterias will remain open to staff/public/visitors for the purchase of food/beverages, but **the seating area will ONLY be available for Healthcare Team use** (as long as social distancing can be maintained). <u>Click here</u> for a new sign to support this change.
- All waiting rooms will close immediately. Visitors should be asked to wait outside or in their cars. <u>Click here</u> for a new sign to support this change.

Healthcare Team

- MHC's current remote work policy will extend through January 1, 2022.
- Meetings should be conducted virtually with onsite meetings only happening by exception.
- MHC will be moving towards reinitiating pre-procedure testing for COVID-19 for **all** patients. More information will follow on when and how this will be implemented.
- Operational leaders will continually evaluate services, including surgeries and procedures, and make necessary adjustments to support patient-care needs.
