Please deliver this letter as intended public comments for the 9/9/21 special meeting of the Board of Commissioners.

A close friend who spends the summer at her cottage in Northport saw the notice of a special meeting of the Leelanau BOC to discuss and/or take action on the Benzie/Leelanau District Health Department Mask Order. My friend, a retired school teacher, called me and asked, "would they (the BOC) consider not being in support of their own county's health department's recommendation for masking school children? What would be their reasoning?"

To be honest, I could not come up with a legitimate rationale for challenging our health department's recommendation to protect children AND to keep our schools open. The residents of Leelanau County, Democrats and Republicans alike, have chosen prevention by getting vaccinated. Leelanau County has the highest vaccination rates, both for 1<sup>st</sup> dose and for fully vaccinated, in the state.
