Habitat Homeownership

- Habitat Homeowners buy their homes with an affordable mortgage
- Affordable payments, including property taxes and homeowners insurance are 30% of monthly income
- Homes are sold at appraised market value to preserve neighborhood value
- Habitat makes up any financing shortfalls with available funding programs and with a silent second mortgage.

Habitat Homeowners are good neighbors

- Area residents for at least one year
- Credit score above 640
- Complete 275 Sweat Equity hours per adult working on their homes or community projects
- Complete money management and homeownership classes
- Save at least \$1,000 into an Individual Development Account


Habitat Homes Build Community

Three 2-home units on a 3.9 acre parcel








